Wisconsin 4-H License Plate Marketing Materials Now Available

The Wisconsin 4-H license plate is now available for cars, trucks and motor homes. The specialty plate, available through the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles, supports the Wisconsin 4-H program and bears the message 4-H Empowering Youth. The sale of the plate includes a fee that goes to the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation. Half of the proceeds from every plate sale will go back to the county in which the plate was purchased. The other half will be used for state and regional 4-H programs.

Summer 4-H Intern – Lafayette County





Employment Period: 10 Weeks (late May/early June – mid-August) Start and end date are flexible

Summary: Under the general direction of the 4-H Youth Development Educator and County Support Staff, this position is designed to support and expand 4-H youth development opportunities and other knowledge of youth development programs, volunteer development, community partnerships, office operations and UW-Extension. This summer position provides valuable pre-professional experience for educational, agricultural, and community-based careers.

Position Responsibilities:

- * Serve as an educational resource and assist in providing leadership to the 4-H Ambassadors and 4-H Adult Leaders Association as they plan fundraising and promotional activities throughout the summer.
- * Assist Support Staff with office clerical duties, as needed, including mailing, registration and result entries, evaluation tabulations, and newsletter formatting.
- * Attend 4-H Ambassador and select committee meetings, most of which occur in the evenings.
- * Assist in the logistical support of the Lafayette County Fair and other judging competitions, as educational experiences for junior exhibitors, including:
- * Preparing county fair judging, superintendent, and exhibitor materials as directed
- * Assisting in the supervision of county fair setup and take down days
- * Being present at the county fair and provide assistance and leadership to youth judging and scheduled events, as needed
- * Transporting non-animal exhibits to and from state fair, if needed
- * Assist with Area Animal Science Days as needed
- * Support Educational Planning and implementation of Animal Science programs, including:
- * Providing assistance and leadership, as needed to youth teams and coaches attending Area Animal Science Day
- * Assist with 4-H Camp (logistics before and attend camp as a chaperone)
- * Assist with logistics and possibly chaperone State 4-H Youth Conference in Madison
- * Develop, implement and evaluate a 3-4 part summer outreach teaching experience, for elementary age youth, in a 4-H project area of interest that builds life skills
- * Comply with and document efforts related to UW-Extension initiatives and Civil Rights laws

- * Communication and marketing skills news releases, newsletter, radio & social media
- * Volunteer development skills recruit, train and support youth and adult volunteers

Salary: \$3500 Scholarship, to be paid as follows: (\$1500 will be paid at the beginning of the summer – for living expenses; \$2000 scholarship to be paid at the completion of the summer internship). Hours per week are flexible, depending upon work plan for the week.

2019 Tractor Safety

TRACTOR SAFETY CERTIFICATION PROGRAM SPONSORED BY:

UW-Extension Lafayette County
Lafayette County Sheriff's Department
Lafayette County FFA/Agriculture Education Department



Wisconsin law dictates that youth must be at least 12 years of age to enroll in this program. Completing all requirements of the program enables youth working for their parents to legally drive a tractor on public roads and 14 or 15-year olds working for a non-parent employer to drive tractors and operate machinery as a job-related activity. Youth participants are offered a wide range of information on safe tractor/machinery operation and specific safety guidelines when working on a crop or livestock farm.

You must meet all of the following requirements to be certified:

- 1. Be at least 12 years old at the time of the course
- 2. Attend 24 hours of instructional training
- 3. Pass a written examination with a minimum score of 70%.
- 4. Pass a driving examination, which demonstrates tractor driving ability.

Youth who enroll in this program will learn

- To increase awareness of safety issues concerning the operation of farm machinery
- To identify potentially hazardous situations and reduce the risk of injury
- To identify and operate tractor controls, instruments and safety checks.
- To effectively drive a tractor with a two wheel implement through an obstacle course to complete their certification Following are the dates and times for the tractor safety certification program:

Dear Lafayette County Swine Exhibitor:

Spring is officially here – and it is time to get your 2019 market swine purchased! Please stop into the UW-Extension Office and pick up your swine tags between March 18 and April 30, 2019. Your completed paperwork will be due back to the UW-Extension office by May 3, 2019.

There will be NO central weigh-in location for your market swine again this year. Each exhibitor will be responsible to identify their own market swine this year. You will need to stop into the UW-Extension Office and pick up the tags needed for each pig (limit 4 tags per exhibitor). *To help cover costs, there will be a \$2.00 per tag cost to each exhibitor. Please make checks payable to: LCLC.* You will be responsible to put the tags in the ears and return the required paper work to the UW-Extension Office by May 3, 2019. If you need to purchase a tagger (at cost) please contact Center Hill Veterinary Clinic.

You will have the opportunity to scan your market swine and compete in the lean gain contest (which replaced the carcass show), the same as in the previous year. The fee(s) will come out of your auction check after the sale of your market swine.


GILTS will be allowed to be shown in the market swine classes in 2019 (along with the barrows). The same rules apply: each exhibitor will only be allowed to show 2 market swine at the County Fair. The show will be TERMINAL (everything must sell).

EXTRA market swine will need to be declared at the scale during weigh-ins at the County Fair. A receipt will need to be signed at that time also. As the spring show season starts, please take bio-security seriously. Please review the Swine Movement Rules at the WDATCP site: https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/SwineMovement.aspx
